The Portland-Vancouver Metro Area Smokefree Housing Project is a partnership between the American Lung Association of Oregon, Multnomah County Health Department and Clark County Public Health. Together with our Advisory Board, we are working with property managers to demonstrate how no-smoking rules are a win-win for business and for health.

Our project currently serves four counties that make up the Portland-Vancouver Metro Area in Oregon and Washington. The four counties are: Multnomah, Clackamas and Washington counties (Oregon) and Clark County (Washington).

3. To build capacity for public policy change through our work with both landlord associations, renter associations, and individual landlord and renter advocates.
